

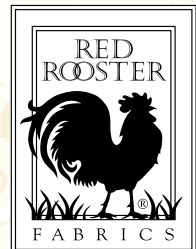
JACOBEBAN JEWELS

Quilt design and piecing by Laura Blanchard
Machine quilting by A Needle Runs Through It



Finished quilt size: 75" x 92"

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Fabrics from the "Jacobean Jewels" collection (style #3863) by Red Rooster Fabrics.

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

- A. Pattern #20447 – MUL1 5 or 3⁵/₈ yards*
- B. Pattern #19648 – LTGRE1 1 yard
- C. Pattern #20447 – LTYEL1 3/4 yard
- D. Pattern #20449 – DKPLU1 1/2 yard
- E. Pattern #16944 – GRE1 1/4 yard
- F. Pattern #19648 – OLII 1²/₃ yards
- G. Pattern #19648 – GRE1 1 1/4 yards
- H. Pattern #20451 – MUL1 3/4 yard
- I. Pattern #16944 – DKPLU1 1/2 yard
- Backing 7 yards
- Batting 83" x 100"

*Note: Pattern #20447 – MUL1 is used for the outer border and is fussy-cut to show the vines. It is also used to fussy-cut 8 identical flowers for the baskets. As with all fussy-cut fabrics, there will be significant waste. An option is to not fussy-cut the border which will require 3⁵/₈ yards. This will also allow for fussy-cutting 8 different flowers for the baskets.

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. 1/4" seam allowance is included in measurements and all strips are cut across the width of the fabric unless noted otherwise. Cut fabrics in order given. Label all pieces and place in separate piles for each block or unit.

A. Pattern #20447 – MUL1 (large multi-colored floral):

1. Cut (2) identical 10" x 82" strips for top and bottom outer borders. **Note:** If lesser amount of yardage for this fabric was purchased, cut (4) 10" x 98" strips. The strips will not be identical. Trim the length of 2 of the strips to 82" for the top and bottom borders. Disregard step 2.
2. Cut (2) identical 10" x 98" strips for side outer borders.
3. From remaining fabric, fussy-cut (8) half-square triangles using the template provided (A - Block I).

B. Pattern #19648 – LTGRE1 (medium floral tone-on-tone):

1. Cut (3) 4 1/4" strips. Crosscut (20) 4 1/4" squares (label B - Block I).
2. Cut (2) 6 1/2" strips. Crosscut (20) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles (B - Block I).
3. Cut (4) 6 7/8" squares. Cut each square in half once on diagonal (B - Block I).

C. Pattern #20447 – LTYEL1 (large floral tone-on-tone):

1. Cut (2) 7 1/4" strips. Crosscut (11) 7 1/4" squares (C). Reserve 6 squares for Block II and 5 squares for the Triangle Unit.
2. Cut (4) 6 7/8" squares. Cut each square in half once on diagonal (C - Block III).

D. Pattern #20449 – DKPLU1 (floral vine):

1. Cut (3) 4 1/4" strips. Crosscut (20) 4 1/4" squares (D - Block I).

E. Pattern #16944 – GRE1 (tone-on-tone):

1. Cut (4) 7 1/4" squares. Cut each square in half once on diagonal (E - Block I).

F. Pattern #19648 – OLII (medium floral tone-on-tone):

1. Cut (9) 2 1/2" strips for binding.

2. Cut two 7 1/4" strips. Crosscut (8) 7 1/4" squares (F). Reserve 3 squares for Block II and 5 squares for the Triangle Unit.
3. Cut (1) 13 1/4" square. Cut square in half twice on diagonal to yield 4 triangles (F - Block III).
4. Cut (8) 3 7/8" squares. Cut each square in half once on diagonal (F - Block I).

G. Pattern #19648 – GRE1 (medium floral tone-on-tone):

1. Cut (1) 13 1/4" square. Cut square in half twice on diagonal to yield 4 triangles (G - Block III).
2. Cut (5) 9 3/4" squares. Cut each square in half twice on diagonal (G - Triangle Unit).
3. Cut (2) 9 3/8" squares. Cut each square in half once on diagonal (G - Corner Triangle).
4. Cut (9) 7 1/4" squares (G - Block II). Cut only 6 squares in half once on diagonal.

H. Pattern #20451 – MUL1 (stripe):

1. Cut (2) 5 5/8" strips. Use the 45° angle line on your ruler to cut 12 triangles as shown in Figure 1 (H - Block II).

2. Cut (2) 4 7/8" strips. Referring to Figure 1, use the 45° angle line on your ruler to cut 8 triangles (H - Block III).

I. Pattern #16944 – DKPLU1 (tone-on-tone):

- Cut (7) 2" strips for inner border.

PIECING INSTRUCTIONS:

MAKING HALF-SQUARE-TRIANGLE UNITS

Follow these directions to make half-square-triangle units:

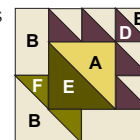
- a. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the lighter fabric square.
- b. Pair designated fabrics, right sides together.
- c. Stitch 1/4" away from each side of the drawn line.
- d. Cut the unit apart on the drawn line.
- e. Press as directed. Trim off "dog ears".
- f. Square up each unit to the size indicated.

Draw a line. Stitch. Cut. Press. Trim and square up.



I. Block I – The Basket Block:

- a. Make 40 half-square-triangle units from the 4 1/4" B and D squares. Square each unit to 3 1/2" x 3 1/2".
- b. Sew F triangle to B rectangle in the position shown in Figure 2. Press toward F. Make 8.
- c. Sew F triangle to B rectangle as shown in Figure 3. Press toward F. Make 8.



Finished block size: 12" square

- d. Sew A to E along the long diagonal edge. Press toward E. Square up to $6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$. Make 8.

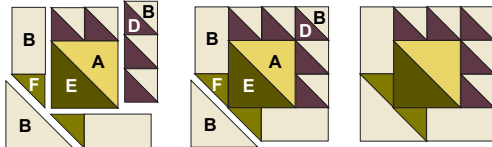
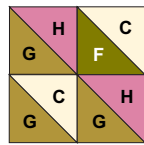


Figure 4 **Make 8 of Block I.**

- e. Complete the blocks as shown in Figure 4. Press. Make 8 of Block I.

2. Block II:

- a. Make 6 half-square-triangle units from 3 C squares and 3 G squares. Press toward G. Square up each unit to $6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$.
- b. Make 6 half-square-triangle units from 3 C squares and 3 F squares. Press toward C. Square up each unit to $6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$.
- c. Sew 12 H triangles to 12 G triangles along the long edge. Press 6 toward H and 6 toward G. Square up each unit to $6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$. [Tip: The short sides of the H triangles are bias edges, so handle carefully and do not over press.]

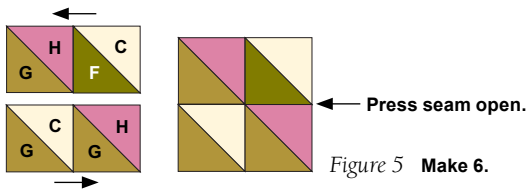
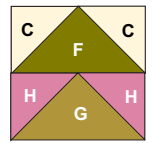


Figure 5 **Make 6.**

- d. For each block, sew one C/F, one C/G and two H/G units together (Figure 5). Press in direction of arrows. Press final seam open. Make 6 blocks.



Finished block size: 12" square Make 6.

3. Block III:

- a. Sew C triangles to F triangles. Press toward C. Make 4.
- b. Sew H triangles to G triangles. Press toward H. Make 4.

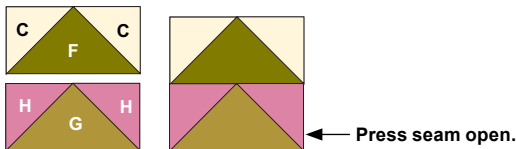


Figure 6 **Make 4.**

- c. Sew the two units together to complete Block III (Figure 6). Press final seam open. Make 4 blocks.



Finished Block Size: 12" square Make 4.

4. Triangle Unit:

- a. Make 10 half-square-triangle units from 5 C squares and 5 F squares. Press toward F. Square up each unit to $6\frac{1}{2}'' \times 6\frac{1}{2}''$. **Make 10.**

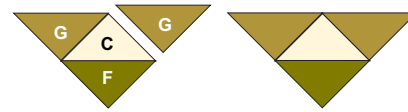
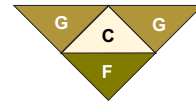
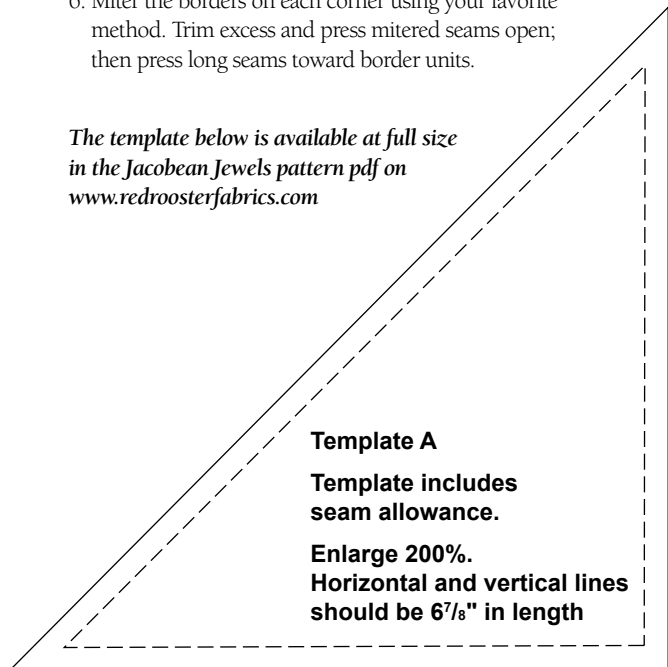


Figure 7 **Make 10.**

- b. Sew G triangle to each side of C/F square as shown in Figure 7 to complete the Triangle Unit. Press toward G. Make 10 triangle units.

QUILT ASSEMBLY:

1. Arrange Blocks I, II, and III, the triangle units, and the corner triangles (G) as shown in the Quilt Diagram. Sew the units into diagonal rows. Press so that seams will be opposing from row to row. Sew rows together. Press seams toward the top left corner of the quilt.
2. Sew the inner border strips together end to end. Press seams open. Cut two 60" lengths and two 80" lengths.
3. Sew the 60" inner border strips to each of the 82" outer border strips along the long edges, matching centers.
4. Sew the border units to the top and bottom of the quilt, beginning and ending the stitching $\frac{1}{4}''$ from each corner of the quilt.
5. Repeat steps 2, 3, and 4 for the side inner and outer border strips.
6. Miter the borders on each corner using your favorite method. Trim excess and press mitered seams open; then press long seams toward border units.

FINISHING:

1. Prepare a backing, using three widths of fabric and horizontal seams, to measure 83" x 100". Press seams open.
2. Layer quilt top, batting and backing. Baste layers together.
3. Quilt as desired.
4. Trim layers even with quilt top.
5. Join binding strips with diagonal seams. Press seams open. Sew binding to quilt using your favorite method.

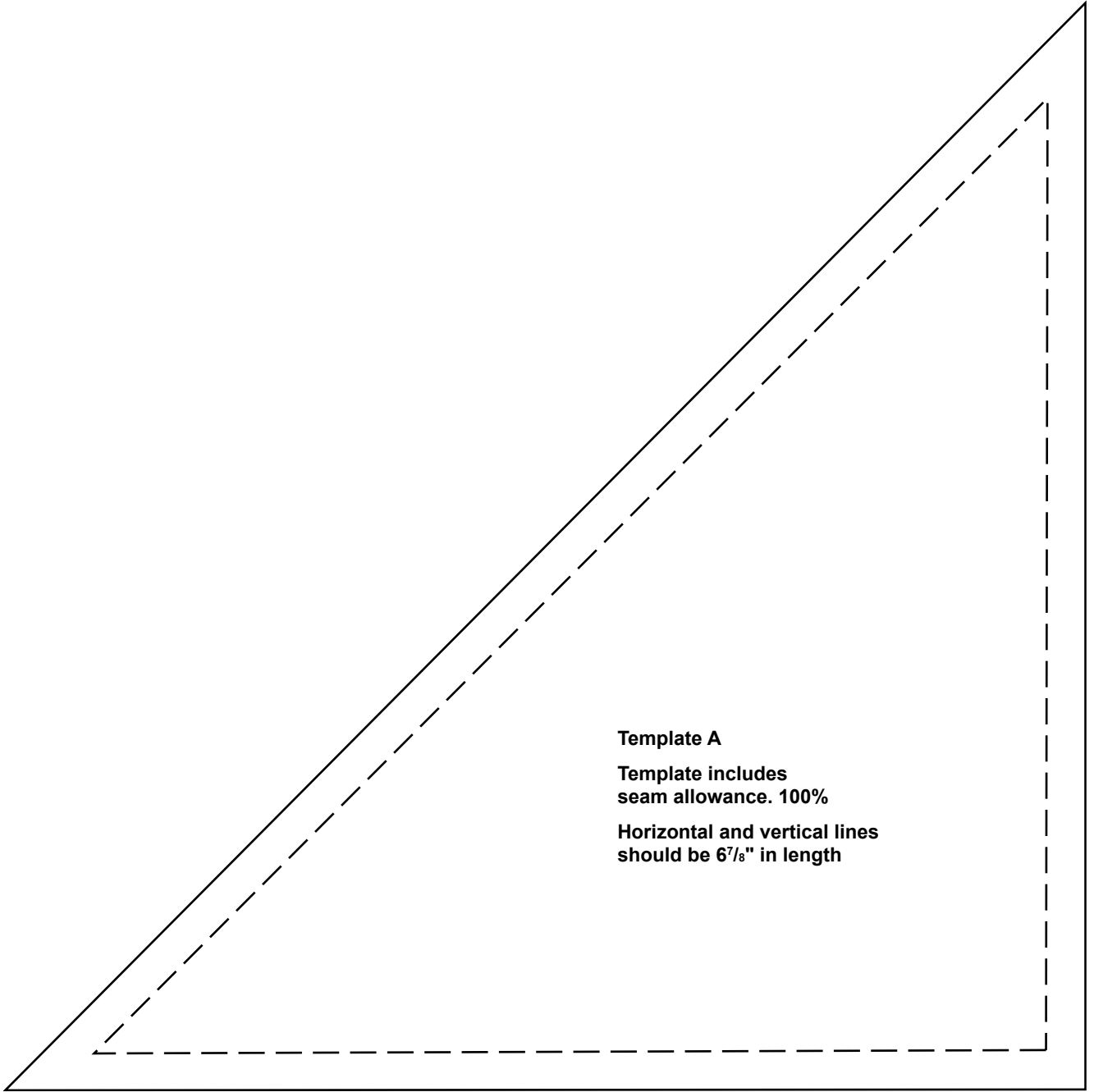


Quilt Diagram
