## FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

Pattern #16853 – LTBLU1.....	5 yards
16853 – BLU1.....	1½ yards
16854 – LTBLU1 .....	1⅞ yards
16855 – BLU1.....	⅝ yard
16858 – LTBE11.....	½ yard
16858 – LTBLU1 .....	⅝ yard
16858 – DKGRE1.....	¼ yard
16858 – GRE1 .....	¼ yard
16858 – ROS1 .....	½ yard
16859 – DKGOL1 .....	⅝ yard
16859 – DKGRE1.....	¾ yard
16859 – ROS1 .....	⅞ yard
16859 – BE11 .....	¼ yard
16859 – RED1 .....	⅞ yard
16859 – LTBLU1 .....	½ yard
Template plastic .....	4¾" square
Fusible Web .....	1 yard

## CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

### A. Pattern #16853 – LTBLU1 (large floral):

- Trace and cut four large hearts (G) following the Appliqué Instructions for Block 5.
- Reserve remaining fabric for backing.

### B. Pattern #16853 – BLU1 (large floral):

- Using the 4¾" square template, fussy cut thirty-three rose motifs, centering the roses on point (A).

### C. Pattern #16854 – LTBLU1 (stripe):

- Cut four identical 4¾" x 67½" strips on the lengthwise grain (Border – J).

### D. Pattern #16855 – BLU1

(floral with lace and roses):

- Trace and cut twelve small hearts (I) following the Appliqué Instructions for Block 6.

### E. Pattern #16858 – LTBE11 (lace):

- Cut two 6½" x 42" strips. Crosscut twelve 6½" squares (H).

### F. Pattern #16858 – LTBLU1 (lace):

- Cut seven 2½" x 42" strips for binding.

### G. Pattern #16858 – DKGRE1 (lace):

- Cut one 3⅞" x 42" strip. Crosscut ten 3⅞" squares; cut once on the diagonal (D).

### H. Pattern #16858 – GRE1 (lace):

- Cut one 3⅞" x 42" strip. Crosscut four 3⅞" squares; cut once on the diagonal (E).

### I. Pattern #16858 – ROS1 (lace):

- Cut three 3⅞" x 42" strips. Crosscut twenty-eight 3⅞" squares; cut once on the diagonal (C).

### J. Pattern #16859 – DKGOL1 (vines):

- Cut ten 1½" x 42" strips. Crosscut twelve 1½" x 6½" strips, twenty-four 1½" x 7½" strips, and twelve 1½" x 8½" strips (Block 1).

### K. Pattern #16859 – DKGRE1 (vines):

- Cut thirteen 1½" x 42" strips. Crosscut fourteen 1½" x 6½" strips, twenty-eight 1½" x 7½" strips, and fourteen 1½" x 8½" strips (Block 2).

### L. Pattern #16859 – ROS1 (vines):

- Cut two 1½" x 42" strips. Crosscut two 1½" x 6½" strips, four 1½" x 7½" strips, and two 1½" x 8½" strips (Block 4).

### M. Pattern #16859 – BE11 (vines):

- Cut five 1½" x 42" strips. Crosscut five 1½" x 6½" strips, ten 1½" x 7½" strips, and five 1½" x 8½" strips (Block 3).

### N. Pattern #16859 – RED1 (vines):

- Cut one 8½" x 42" strip. Crosscut four 8½" squares (F).
- Cut ten 1½" x 42" strips. Crosscut twelve 1½" x 6½" strips, twenty-four 1½" x 7½" strips, and twelve 1½" x 8½" strips (Block 6).

### O. Pattern #16859 – LTBLU1 (vines):

- Cut three 3⅞" x 42" strips. Crosscut twenty-four 3⅞" squares; cut once on the diagonal (B).

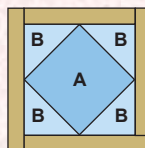
**PIECING INSTRUCTIONS:** All seam allowances are ¼".

**Square in a Square Blocks: Make 33.**

**Finished Block Size: 8" x 8"**

### Block 1:

- Sew a 3½" half-square triangle (B) to each corner of an A square (Figure 1). Press toward B. Make twelve.

**Make 12 Blocks.**

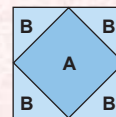

- B. Sew one  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " strip, two  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $7\frac{1}{2}$ " strips and one  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " strip to the A/B units in the sequence shown in Figure 2.

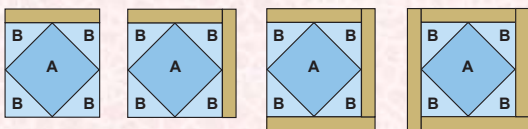
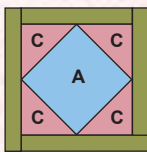


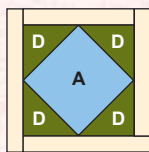

### Blocks 2, 3, and 4:

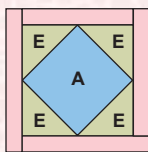
- A. Sew Blocks 2, 3, and 4 following the Piecing Instructions for Block 1.

Make 14 Blocks.



**Block 3**  
Make 5 Blocks.

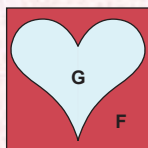


**Block 4**  
Make 2 Blocks.

### APPLIQUÉ INSTRUCTIONS:

#### Block 5:

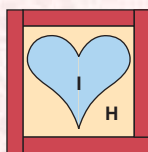
- Trace four large hearts onto the paper side of fusible web.
- Rough cut the hearts from the fusible web.
- Following the manufacturer's directions, fuse the hearts to the wrong side of the large floral (G), centering the hearts on a rose motif.
- Cut out the heart shapes. Peel off the paper. Center on the background squares (F). Fuse.
- Machine appliqué the hearts to the backgrounds with a decorative stitch.



**Block 5**  
Make 4 Blocks.

#### Block 6:

- Trace twelve small hearts onto the paper side of fusible web.
- Rough cut the hearts from the fusible web.
- Fuse the hearts to the wrong side of I, centering a rose motif.
- Cut out the heart shapes. Peel off the paper. Center on the background squares (H). Fuse.
- Sew the outer strips as indicated in Figure 2.
- Machine appliqué the hearts to the backgrounds with a decorative stitch.



**Block 6**  
Make 12 Blocks.

### QUILT ASSEMBLY:

- Refer to Figure 3 to arrange the blocks into seven rows of seven blocks each.
- Sew the blocks into rows. Press seams in opposite directions from row to row.
- Sew the rows together. Press.
- Mitered Borders:
  - Sew the border strips (J) to the quilt center, mitering each corner. Press toward the border.

### FINISHING:

- Prepare backing with a vertical seam to measure  $71$ " x  $71$ ". Press seam open.
- Layer quilt top, batting, and backing. Baste layers together.
- Quilt as desired.
- Trim batting and backing even with quilt top.
- Join binding strips with diagonal seams. Apply binding using your favorite method.
- Cut four 1 yard lengths of ribbon. Tie four bows and sew or glue the centers of the knots to the four large hearts. Shape the bows and tails as desired.
- Make a hanging sleeve from remaining backing fabric and attach to the back of the quilt.

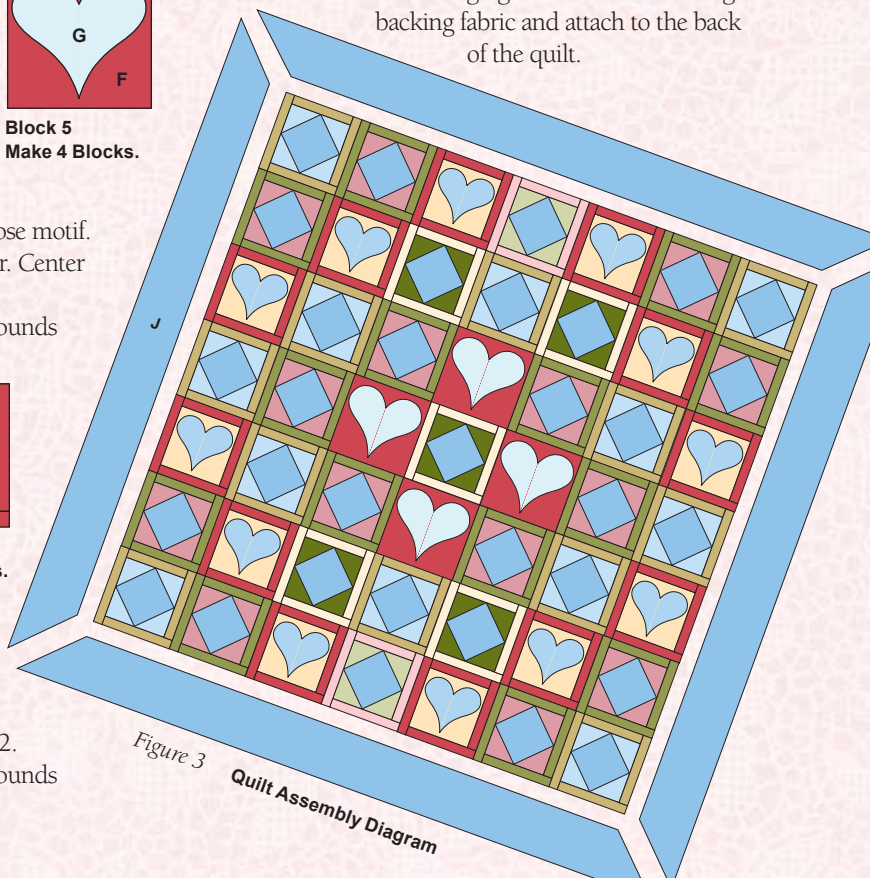
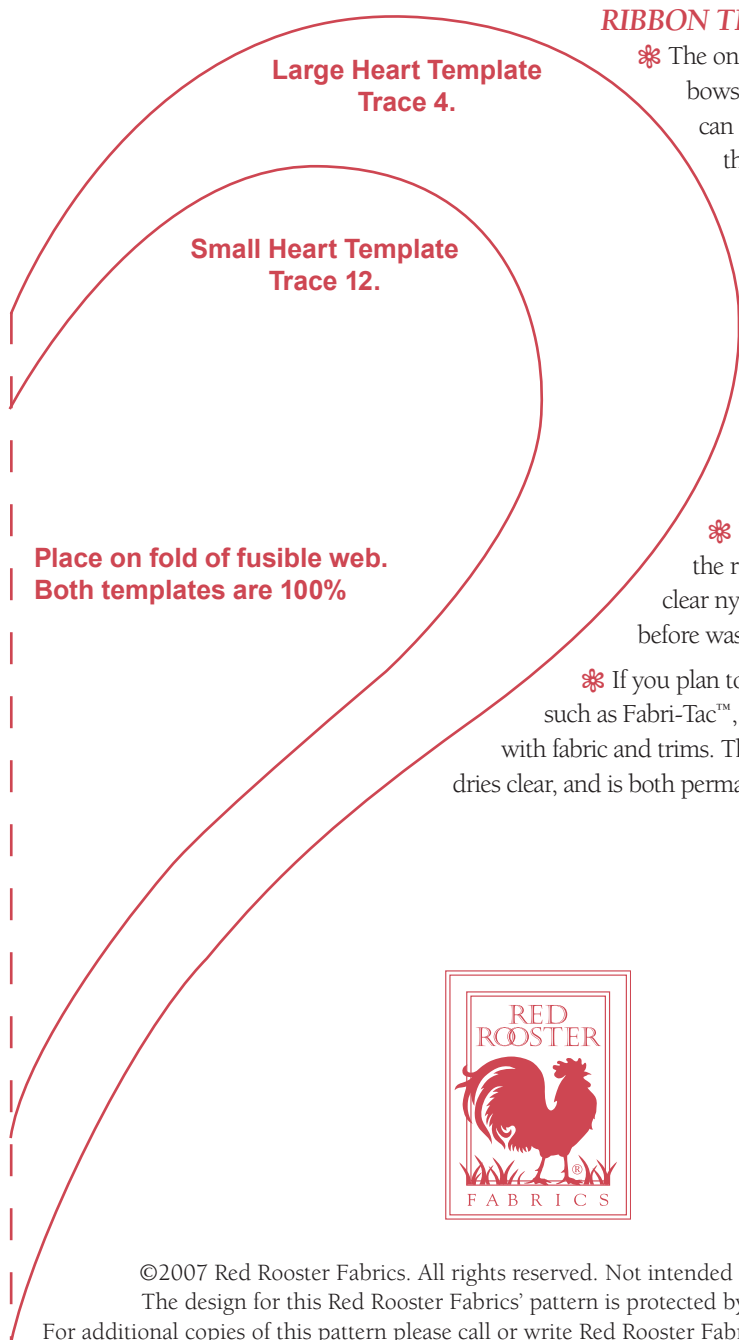

**Large Heart Template  
Trace 4.**

**Small Heart Template  
Trace 12.**

**Place on fold of fusible web.  
Both templates are 100%**

**RIBBON TIPS:**

\* The one yard cuts of ribbon for these bows allow enough length so that you can tie a generous bow and manipulate the bow and the tails into pretty folds.

\* Wire-edged ribbon can be "ironed" by running it over the edge of a table or with an iron on a warm setting. Always test a small length of the ribbon first to make sure it doesn't melt.

**Caution:** even on a warm setting, the wire will get hot!

\* If you plan to wash the quilt, sew the ribbon on with matching color or clear nylon thread so you can remove it before washing.

\* If you plan to glue the ribbon on, use a glue such as Fabri-Tac™, which is formulated for use with fabric and trims. This glue goes on clear and dries clear, and is both permanent and washable.



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
