QUILT FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

- A. Pattern #19780 – MUL1.....one panel
 - B. Pattern #19781 – MUL1.....1½ yards
 - C. Pattern #19782 – MUL1.....¼ yard or fat quarter
 - D. Pattern #19782 – GRE1½ yard
 - E. Pattern #19782 – DKRED1.....1 yard
 - F. Pattern #19782 – BLU1.....⅝ yard
 - G. Pattern #19782 – YEL1¾ yard
 - H. Pattern #19783 – BLU1.....⅔ yard
 - I. Pattern #19785 – MUL1.....¼ yard or fat quarter
- Backing of choice.....3⅝ yards
 Batting.....64" x 70"

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. ¼" seam allowance is included in measurements and all strips are cut across the width of the fabric unless noted otherwise. Label pieces and keep together until ready to sew.

A. Pattern #19780 – MUL1 (panel):

1. Cut center block 16½" x 20½". Cut six small blocks along outer edge of red/yellow frame. These will measure approximately 6⅝" x 9⅛".

B. Pattern #19781 – MUL1 (repeating stripe):

1. Cut three 6½" x 48½". **Note:** you should be able to cut these 6½" widths continuously across fabric by cutting through center of green dot separator strip.

C. Pattern #19782 – MUL1 (multicolor dots):

1. Cut eleven 3½" squares.

D. Pattern #19782 – GRE1 (green dots):

1. Cut two 3½" strips; subcut twelve 3½" squares.
2. Cut six 1" strips. Sew together end-to-end and press. Cut into four equal lengths.

E. Pattern #19782 – DKRED1 (red dots):

1. Cut four 2½" strips; subcut six 2½" x 7" and 2½" x 13½".
2. Cut two 2¼" strips; subcut two 2¼" x 24½".
3. Cut seven 2½" strips. Sew together end-to-end and press. Cut into four equal lengths.

F. Pattern #19782 – BLU1 (blue dots):

1. Cut two 3½" strips; subcut twelve 3½" squares.
2. Cut six 2" strips. Sew together end-to-end and press. Cut into four equal lengths.

G. Pattern #19782 – YEL1 (yellow/red dots):

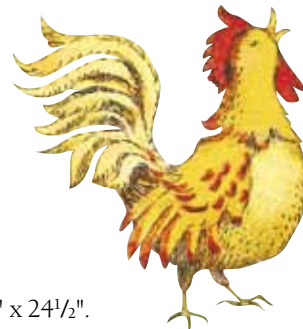
1. Cut four 2½" strips; subcut six 2½" x 7" and six 2½" x 13½".
2. Cut two 2¼" strips; subcut two 2¼" x 24½".
3. Cut six 1½" strips. Sew together end-to-end and press. Cut into four equal lengths.

H. Pattern #19783 – BLU1 (blue plaid):

1. Cut two 2½" strips. From each strip, cut one 2½" x 16½" and one 2½" x 24½".
2. Cut seven 2¼" strips for binding.

I. Pattern #19785 – MUL1 (tossed animal print):

1. Cut thirteen 3½" squares.



ORGANIZER FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

- A. Pattern #19780 – MUL11 panel
 - B. Pattern #19781 – MUL11⅞ yards
 - OR: use remainder from quilt project
 - C. Pattern #19782 – GRE1¾ yard
 - D. Pattern #19783 – BLU1½ yard
 - E. Pattern #19785 – MUL11 yard (backing)
- Heavy-duty fusible non-woven interfacing.....1 yard
 OPTIONAL: Fusible polyester fleece1 yard
 Six ½" buttons
 Two 1¼" buttons
 2 packages jumbo rickrack

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. ¼" seam allowance is included in measurements and all strips are cut across the width of the fabric unless noted otherwise.

A. Pattern #19780 – MUL1 (panel):

1. Cut the six small blocks approx ¼" beyond red/yellow frames. NOTE: Large center block can be incorporated into the backing as an additional large pocket!
 Or – use it in any number of ways including front of tote/diaper bag or basis for a coordinating snuggle quilt.

B. Pattern #19781 – MUL1 (repeating stripe):

1. Cut two 6½" x 36½" strips from length of fabric centering motif area within strip.



Finished organizer size: 32" x 36"

PIECING INSTRUCTIONS:

Large Panel Block:

1. Referring to Figure 1, sew one [H] 2½" x 16½" strip to each side of large block; press. Sew one [H] 2½" x 24½" to top and bottom; press.
2. Sew one [G] 2¼" x 24½" to top and bottom of block; press. Repeat using [E] 2¼" x 24½" strips.

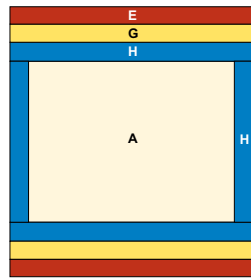

Small Panel Blocks:

1. Referring to Figure 2 and quilt photo, sew one [E] 2½" x 7" to both sides of three small blocks by centering strip to sides of block; press. Sew one [G] 2½" x 13½" to top and bottom of blocks by centering strip to block; press. **Please Note:** these frame strips will not match size of block exactly as block will then be trimmed to required size. Trim blocks to 9½" x 12½" keeping panel block centered within frames.
2. Sew [G] 2½" x 7" and [E] 2½" x 13½" frames to remaining small blocks following step 1 above (Figure 3).

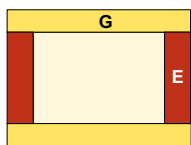

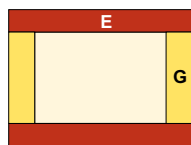
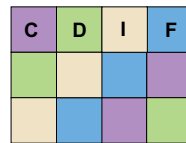

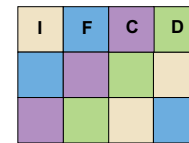
PLEASE NOTE:
E and G strips will be larger than the blocks. Trim blocks to 9½" x 12½" keeping the panel block centered within frames.

Patchwork Blocks:

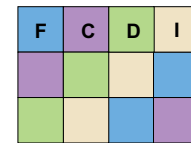
1. Patchwork Block #1, #2 and #3: use three 3½" squares each of [C], [D], [F] and [I] for each block. Sew squares together as shown and press.

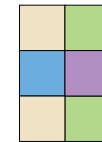

2. Patchwork Block #4: use the following 3½" squares – one [C], two [D], one [F] and two [I]. Sew squares together as shown and press.

3. Patchwork Block #5: use the following 3½" squares – one [C], one [D], two [F] and two [I]. Sew squares together as shown and press.



C. Pattern #19782 – GRE1 (green dots):

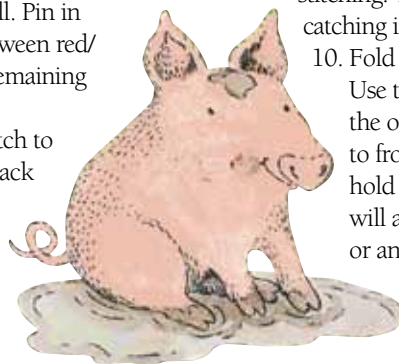
1. Cut two 10½" x 36½".

D. Pattern #19783 – BLUI (blue plaid):

1. Use one cut panel block as a template to cut six matching rectangles for pocket lining.
2. Use same technique to cut six rectangles from interfacing.
3. Cut two 8" squares.

ASSEMBLY & FINISHING:

1. Following product instructions, fuse interfacing to wrong side of each [A] panel block. With right sides together, sew each panel block to a [D] lining rectangle along top edge only. Turn and press. Topstitch along top edge. Stitch around inner edge of blue frame to highlight motif area and anchor layers together. You can use decorative stitching and/or thread for this if you wish.
2. Referring to photo above, arrange three pocket blocks evenly along one [C] 10½" x 36½" strip centering vertically as well. Pin in place and stitch sides and bottom. Place stitching between red/yellow frame and raw edge of pocket. Repeat using remaining three pocket blocks and green strip.
3. Fold under raw edge at beginning of rickrack and stitch to all pockets using matching thread. Try to center rickrack over raw edge of pocket. Fold under end of rickrack and catch fold in stitching. Sew a small button at top corners of each pocket.
4. Sew a [B] 6½" x 36½" strip to top of both pocket rows. Join two sections together; press.



5. To make hanging tabs, fold one [D] 8" square in half with right sides together. Sew along long edge and bottom only to create a tube. Turn inside out; press. Repeat with remaining square.
6. If using fusible fleece, follow product instructions and fuse to back side of organizer. Trim layers even. Otherwise, cut thin batting of choice the same size as organizer front. Cut backing fabric in the same way.
7. Layer front and back of organizer with right sides together and batting on top. Insert hanging tabs between front and back with raw edges even with organizer. Position tabs evenly along edge as shown in photo. Pin in place as well as around all edges of organizer.
8. Attach a walking foot to your machine if you have one. You will begin stitching along the bottom edge of organizer using ¼" seam allowance. Stitch around all edges pivoting at corners. Leave an opening along the bottom so that you can turn the organizer right sides out.
9. Trim bulk from corners by cutting at an angle approximately ¼" from stitching. Turn right sides out and press. Topstitch around edges catching in the folds of the opening at bottom.
10. Fold tabs to front and add large buttons to hold in place. Use this method if you will be hanging the organizer from a rod. Or – sew buttons to fronts of tabs only and use Velcro® to hold in place on front of organizer. This will allow you to hang from side of crib or another location with a stationary edge.



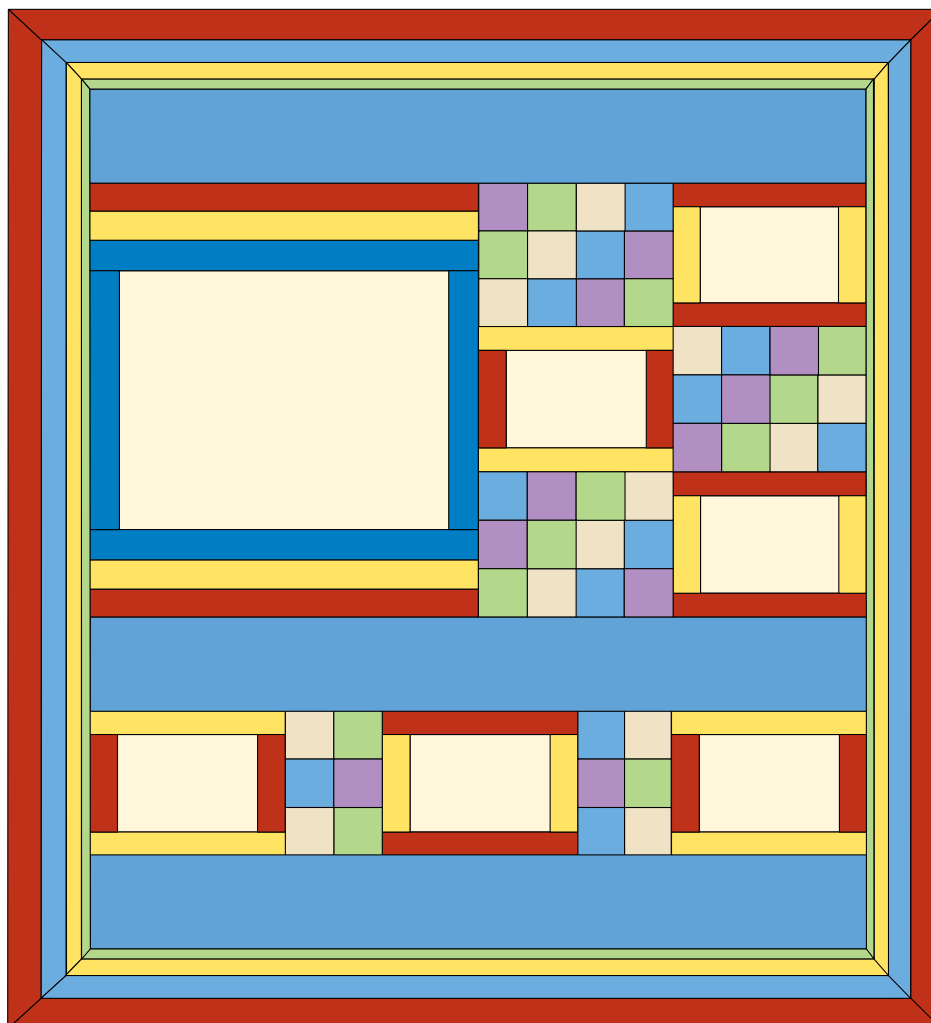
QUILT ASSEMBLY:

1. Refer to the photo and quilt diagram to assemble small panel blocks and patchwork blocks together into sections; press.
2. Sew sections together with large panel block and $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x $48\frac{1}{2}$ " stripe strips to complete quilt center; press..
3. Create rainbow border by using one length of [D] 1", [G] $1\frac{1}{2}$ ", [F] 2" and [E] $2\frac{1}{2}$ ". Match centers of strips and sew together; press. Repeat to make four borders.
4. Center side of quilt to center of green strip. Sew border to quilt leaving $\frac{1}{4}$ " open at beginning and end of seam. Repeat for remaining sides of quilt; press.

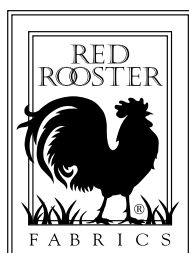
5. Match strip seams and sew border corners closed with mitered seams. Trim seam to $\frac{1}{4}$ " and press open.

FINISHING:

1. Prepare backing using two widths of fabric; seam to be placed horizontally with quilt top.
2. Layer quilt top, batting and backing. Baste layers together.
3. Quilt as desired and trim layers even with quilt top.
4. Sew binding strips together; press. Fold in half with right sides together and sew to quilt.
5. Make a hanging sleeve and label if desired.
