

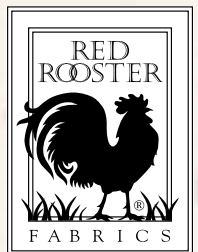

## FABRIC REQUIREMENTS

A. Pattern #19390 – BE11 .....	1 panel
B. Pattern #19391 – BE11 .....	1/2 yard
C. Pattern #19392 – BE11 .....	1/8 yard
D. Pattern #19392 – DKBRO1 .....	2/3 yard
E. Pattern #19392 – GOL1 .....	1/8 yard
F. Pattern #19392 – LTSAG1 .....	1/8 yard
G. Pattern #19393 – GOL1 .....	1/4 yard
H. Pattern #19393 – LTBE11 .....	3/8 yard
I. Pattern #19394 – GOL1 .....	1/4 yard
J. Pattern #19394 – OL11 .....	1/3 yard
K. Pattern #19395 – GOL1 .....	Fat Eighth
L. Pattern #19396 – DKBRO1 .....	3/4 yard
M. Pattern #19397 – LTBE11 .....	1/2 yard

## CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

Please read all instructions carefully before beginning. 1/4" seam allowance is included in measurements and all strips are cut across the width of the fabric unless noted otherwise. Label pieces and keep together until ready to sew.

**A. Pattern #19390 – BE11 (Panel):** Cut out panel blocks allowing 1/4" seam allowance around each one. These are the sizes that were cut for the sample quilt: Pumpkins & Spice Block = 11 1/2" x 23 1/2"; Sunflower Block = 9 1/4" x 20 3/4"; Tree Block = 14" x 20 3/4"; Pumpkins Block = 8" x 23 1/2".

**NOTE:** C, D, E, F frame strips are cut to fit these dimensions. If your panel measurements are slightly different, cut the frame strips slightly larger, sew to panel blocks and trim blocks to size noted in Piecing Instructions.

**B. Pattern #19391 – BE11 (Cat & Pumpkin Scenic):** Cut two 6 1/2" strips; subcut both to 6 1/2" x 40 1/2".

**C. Pattern #19392 – BE11 (Stripe):** Cut two 1 3/8" strips; subcut one 1 3/8" x 10 1/2" from each strip. Trim remainder of both strips to 1 1/8" wide and cut one 1 1/8" x 20 3/4" from each one.

**D. Pattern #19392 – DKBRO1 (Stripe):** Cut two 1 3/4" strips; subcut one 1 3/4" x 24 1/2" from each strip. Trim remainder of both strips to 1" wide and cut two 1" x 8". Cut seven 2 1/4" strips for binding.

**E. Pattern #19392 – GOL1 (Stripe):** Cut two 1" strips; subcut one 1" x 11 1/2" and one 1" x 24 1/2" from each strip.

**F. Pattern #19392 – LTSAG1 (Stripe):** Cut two 1 3/4" strips; subcut one 1 3/4" x 20 3/4" from each one. Trim remainder of both strips to 1 3/8" wide and cut one 1 3/8" x 16 1/2" from each strip.

**G. Pattern #19393 – GOL1 (Dot):** Cut one 6 1/2" strip; subcut one 6 1/2" square and two 5" x 6 1/2". Use remainder of strip to cut two 4 7/8" squares. Cut each in half diagonally to yield four half-square triangles.

**H. Pattern #19393 – LTBE11 (Dot):**

Cut two 2 1/2" strips; subcut eight 2 1/2" squares and eight 2 1/2" x 4 1/2".

Cut one 4 7/8" strip; subcut two 4 7/8" squares.

Cut each square in half diagonally to yield four half-square triangles. Use remainder of strip to cut: one 4 1/4" square – cut diagonally in both directions to yield four quarter-square triangles; four 3 1/4" squares – cut diagonally in both directions to yield sixteen quarter-square triangles and two 3 1/2" squares.

**I. Pattern #19394 – GOL1 (Flower):** Cut one 5" x 6 1/2", one 5 1/2" x 7 1/2" and one 4 7/8" square – cut in half diagonally to yield two half-square triangles.

**J. Pattern #19394 – OL11 (Flower):** Cut five 1 1/2" strips. Sew together end to end and press. Cut two 1 1/2" x 50 1/2" and two 1 1/2" x 46 1/2".

**K. Pattern #19395 – GOL1 (Plaid):** Cut one 6 1/2" square, one 5" x 6 1/2" and one 4 7/8" square – cut in half diagonally to yield two half-square triangles.

**L. Pattern #19396 – DKBRO1 (Wheat):** Cut one 1 1/2" strip; subcut four 1 1/2" x 2", two 1 1/2" x 2 1/2" and one 1 1/2" x 3 1/2". Cut one 6 1/2" strip; subcut four 6 1/2" squares and four 3 1/2" x 6 1/2". From remainder of fabric, cut: two 4 7/8" squares – cut diagonally in half to yield four half-square triangles; two 6 7/8" squares – cut diagonally in half to yield four half-square triangles; one 3 7/8" square – cut diagonally in half to yield two half-square triangles; four 2 7/8" squares – cut diagonally in half to yield eight half-square triangles and two 2 1/2" squares.

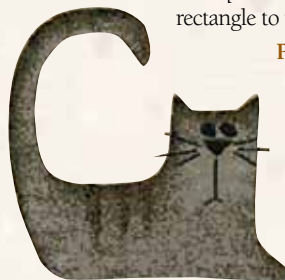
**M. Pattern #19397 – LTBE11 (Sunflower):** Cut one 8 1/2" strip; subcut one 6 1/2" x 8 1/2" and one 8 1/2" x 12 1/2". Use remainder of strip to cut two 6 1/2" squares. Cut one 5 1/2" strip; subcut one 5 1/2" x 10 1/2". Use remainder of strip to cut two 4 1/2" x 14 1/2".

**N. Pattern #19398 – BE11 (Pumpkin Stripe):** Cut two 6 1/2" strips; subcut two 6 1/2" x 40 1/2".

**O. Pattern #19399 – DKTAN1 (Diamonds):** Cut one 6 7/8" strip; subcut eight 1 7/8" x 6 7/8". Cut ends of each rectangle at opposite 45° angles to make eight trapezoid shapes. Use remainder of fabric to cut: four 3 1/4" squares – cut diagonally in both directions to yield sixteen quarter-square triangles; one 4 1/4" square – cut diagonally in both directions to yield four quarter-square triangles; one 4 7/8" square – cut diagonally in half to yield two half-square triangles and two 2 3/8" x 9 3/4". Cut ends of each rectangle to make two trapezoid shapes as detailed above.

**P. Pattern #19399 – LTBE11 (Diamonds):**

Cut one 1 1/2" strip; subcut twenty-three 1 1/2" squares. Cut one 3" strip; subcut eight 2" x 3" and four 2 1/2" x 3". Use remainder of fabric to cut: two 2 1/2" x 3 1/2"; twelve 2" squares and two 6 7/8" squares – cut in half diagonally to yield four half-square triangles. Cut one 4 7/8" square; cut in half to yield two half-square triangles.



## PIECING INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Pumpkins & Spice Panel Block:** Sew a [E] 1" x 11½" to both sides of the block. Sew a 1" x 24½" to top and bottom. Unfinished block size = 12½" x 24½".
- 2. Sunflower Panel Block:** Sew a [C] 1⅛" x 20¾" to both sides of the block. Sew a 1⅜" x 10½" to the top and bottom. Unfinished block size = 10½" x 22½".
- 3. Tree Panel Block:** Sew a [F] 1¾" x 20¾" to both sides of the block. Sew a 1⅜" x 16½" to the top and bottom. Unfinished block size = 16½" x 22½".
- 4. Pumpkins Panel Block:** Sew a [D] 1" x 8" to both sides of the block. Sew a 1¾" x 24½" to the top and bottom. Unfinished block size = 10½" x 24½".

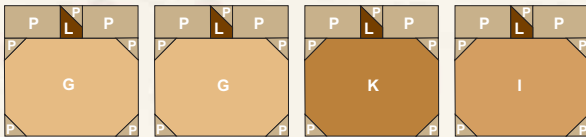


Figure 1 **Pumpkin (A) Blocks. Make 4. Finished size: 6".**

- 5. Pumpkin (A) Blocks:** Refer to Figure 1 for placement. With right sides together, place a [P] 1½" square in each corner of [G], [I], and [K] 5" x 6½" rectangles as well as the end of [L] 1½" x 2" rectangles. Sew diagonally across squares and trim seams to ¼"; press toward triangles. Sew a [P] 2" x 3" rectangle to both sides of each [P/L] stem unit to complete top of blocks. Sew tops and bottoms of blocks together and press toward top. Make four 6" finished blocks.

- 6. Pumpkin (B) Blocks:** Refer to Figure 2 for placement. With right sides together, place a [P] 2" square in each corner of [G] and [K] 6½" squares. Place a [P] 1½" square at the end of each [L] 1½" x 2½" rectangle. Sew diagonally across squares and trim seams to ¼"; press toward triangles. Sew a [P] 2½" x 3" rectangle to both sides of each [P/L] stem unit to complete top of blocks. Sew tops and bottoms of blocks together and press toward top. Make two 6" x 8" finished blocks.
- 7. Pumpkin (C) Block:** Refer to Figure 3 for placement. With right sides together, place a [P] 2" square in each corner of [I] 5½" x 7½" rectangle. Place a [P] 1½" square at the end of each [L] 1½" x 2½" rectangle. Sew diagonally across squares and trim seams to ¼"; press toward triangles. Sew a [P] 2½" x 3½" rectangle to both sides of [P/L] stem unit to complete top of block. Sew top and bottom of block together and press toward top. Make one 5" x 10" finished block.

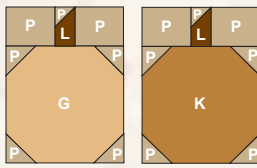

**Finished size: 6" x 8".**

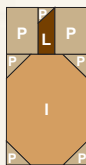

- 8. Flower Block:** Each block has a "bud" in each corner. Refer to Figure 4 to assemble eight buds. Each bud contains two [H] 3¼" triangles, one [H] 2½" square, two [O] 3¼" triangles, one [O] 1⅞" x 6⅞" trapezoid and one [L] 2⅞" triangle. For each block, sew four buds with four [H] 2½" x 4½" rectangles and one [L] 2½" square. Make two 10" finished blocks.
- 9. Flower Bud Blocks:** Each block contains two [H] 4¼" triangles, one [H] 3½" square, two [O] 4¼" triangles, one [O] 2⅞" x 9¾" trapezoid and one [L] 3⅞" triangle. Refer to Figure 5 to assemble. Make two 6" finished blocks.
- 10. Half-Square-Triangle Units:** Sew the following sets of 4⅞" triangles together: two [H/K]; two [H/O]; two [L/G]; two [G/P]; two [I/L]. Make ten half-square-triangle units.

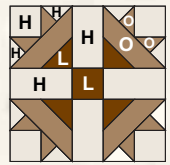

**Finished size: 10" square.**

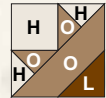

## ASSEMBLY AND FINISHING

- Refer to Figure 6 to assemble five sections of the quilt. Join section 1 to the center Flower Block aligning top of block and section 1. Leave bottom of seam open approximately ½" to allow for joining of section 4. This is called partial-seaming. Continue to add sections in order. After adding section 4 to the bottom of section 3 and center block, complete seam between sections 1 and 4. Finally, add section 5 to the bottom. Press well.

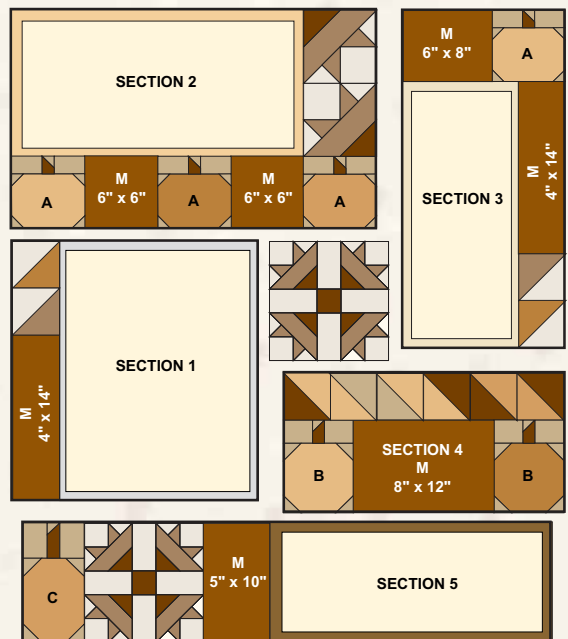
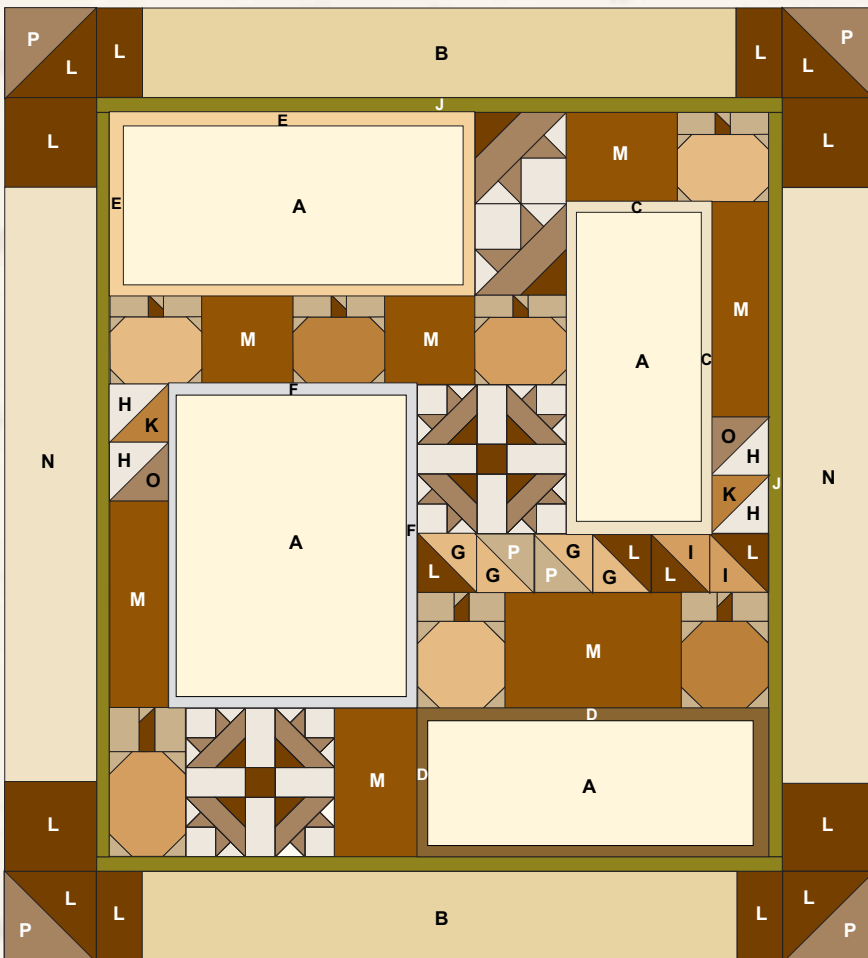

2. Sew a [J]  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $50\frac{1}{2}$ " to both sides of the quilt. Sew a  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $46\frac{1}{2}$ " to the top and bottom. Press.
3. Sew a [L]  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " square to both ends of each [N]  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $40\frac{1}{2}$ " strip. Press. Sew one border to both sides of the quilt with motifs facing in correct direction. Press. Sew a [L]  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to both ends of each [B]  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $40\frac{1}{2}$ " strip. Sew a [L]  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " triangle to a [P]  $6\frac{7}{8}$ " triangle. Press. Repeat for a total of four blocks. Sew one to each end of the [B] borders in the direction shown. Sew to top and bottom of the quilt.
4. Layer quilt top with batting and backing. This quilt is quite "busy" and a simple, overall machine quilting design would work very well. A leaf design was used on the sample quilt. However, you could also stitch in-the-ditch within the pieced areas while adding some outline/trapunto quilting within the panel blocks.
5. Trim layers even with quilt top.
6. Join binding strips with diagonal seams. Attach binding to quilt using your favorite method.
