Nicole's Garden, with its pretty roses on a jacquard ground, works beautifully in quilts, wearables and accessories, and in home decorating projects. Try these prints in traditional pieced basket or star quilts, or simply feature the master print in big squares alternating with easy nine patches from the jacquard or background texture and a variety of rose patterns. Add a striped border, bind, and you're done! Or, you can showcase the big roses on the back of a quilt, making it reversible, or on a duvet cover. Add a striped dust ruffle and mix and match the florals on ruffled pillow shams. Cover a table with the jacquard texture and top it with a floral. Stitch up floral or striped swags and jabots and you've decorated a beautiful room. Display this collection with a stack of fat quarters in each inviting colorway, a basket of pretty pastel threads, and a few of the books and patterns suggested below.
