Try this collection in a blended quilt or make a wonderful duvet cover with the large-scale floral (Pattern #15312) and a dust ruffle from the wide floral stripe (Pattern #15308). Add some pillow shams corded with the small serpentine stripe and valances from the smaller florals to complete your bedroom decor. The collection is also just right for traditional star and basket patterns and broderie perse. The Charlotte collection will be introduced at International Quilt Market in Minneapolis, MN in May, 2006.
