## Sweet Pea

Jill Kemp is a well known quiltmaker, designer, teacher and author. She has published fifteen books and numerous patterns, as well as Block of the Month programs. Sweet Pea, her latest fabric collection for Red Rooster, is fresh and pretty. The master pattern is bursting with flowers, buds, and leaves. There are companion florals in several sizes, a toss of ferns, vines, and a plaid. Try this collection in one of Jill's own quilt patterns. Love Never Fails is a four patch on point with appliquéd borders and Hope Springs Eternal is a nine patch on point, also with appliqué. Sweet Pea would also be wonderful in her Barn Raising pattern, which includes instructions for two log cabin quilts. Cover a stack of boxes with these florals and tie them together with a pretty wire-edge ribbon. Or, stitch up a table runner and some floral placemats and plaid napkins for a quick gift for a friend. Display this collection with Jill's books and patterns, some of the books suggested below, stacks of fat quarters, and a basket of pretty ribbons.

- ✂ *Miss Rosie's Quilt Collection* by Carrie Nelson, Leisure Arts. Fourteen pieced quilts with traditional patterns that showcase harmonious florals.
- ✂ *Romantic Quilts: Lush and Lovely Projects for Your Home* by Australian Patchwork and Quilting Magazine. A compilation of patchwork and appliqué quilts for pretty fabrics.
- ✂ *Quick and Colorful Appliqué*, edited by Rosemary Wilkinson, That Patchwork Place. Sweet baby to bed size quilts for easy piecing and fusible, machine stitched, Hawaiian, and shadow appliqué techniques.
- ✂ *Mostly Table Runners Two* by Calico Printworks. Stitch up a table runner from one of these twenty classic designs and enjoy the recipes, too!
- ✂ *Tea in the Garden* by Cynthia Tomaszewski, That Patchwork Place. Thirteen lap to wall size quilts in pretty pastels, and embellished with buttons and beads.
- ✂ *Focus on Florals* by Terry Martin, That Patchwork Place. Eleven floral quilts that use quick piecing and fusible appliqué.
